Gifts Through Wills and Trusts

A provision for the American College of Sports Medicine Foundation in your will or trust allows you to retain control of your assets during life and make a very significant gift at death.

How it Works: _____

- Designate a gift to the American College of Sports Medicine Foundation in your will or trust.
- Specify a percentage of your estate, a specific asset, or the residue of your estate to the foundation.
- Complete a separate agreement with the foundation to describe the eventual use of your gift.

Benefits: _____

- Donor has satisfaction of making a significant gift to benefit the American College of Sports Medicine.
- Donor retains control of assets during life.
- Donor may receive estate tax savings.
- Gift is easily accomplished through a simple addition to current document.

Benefits to ACSM: _____

- Following the lifetime of the donor, the gift will be used for the benefit of the American College of Sports Medicine according to the donor's wishes.
- Often the gift is much larger than can be given during a donor's lifetime.

Note: The correct legal name for use in all documents is: "The American College of Sports Medicine Foundation, a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the state of Indiana and located in Indianapolis, Indiana."
