

**2021 Dr. Lisa S. Krivickas
Clinician/Scholar Registration Award**

BACKGROUND:

Lisa Stroud Krivickas, MD, FACSMT was a talented scholar, compassionate clinician, loving friend, caring mentor, and a colleague who was devoted to her patients and clinical research. Lisa graduated with distinction from Cornell University School of Engineering and earned her medical degree from Harvard Medical School. She worked at Massachusetts General Hospital in the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation where she was named Associate Chief in 2003. She was promoted to an Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School in 2006 where she served as a Team Physician. She served as Chair of the Strategic Health Initiative for Women and was elected to the board of trustees at the American College of Sports Medicine.



Dr. Krivickas earned several recognition awards in research, clinical care, teaching, and mentoring from the Kessler Institute of Rehabilitation. She won the Outstanding Senior Award of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, received the Distinguished Researcher Award from the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine, and was named a GTE Academic All American in gymnastics. Harvard Medical School Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation also named a mentoring award in Lisa's honor. In addition to her research, clinical trials, and clinical care for patients with ALS, Dr. Krivickas courageously volunteered to serve as the first person living with ALS to be treated with a novel and potentially very risky, but scientifically progressive treatment.

Dr. Krivickas enjoyed family life, with her husband and two children, both in grade school at the time of her death. On September 22, 2009, Lisa died of ALS, leaving behind her loving family and with the faith they would one day all be reunited. In honor of her work in sports medicine and exercise science, a clinician / scholar travel award fund was established as tribute to Lisa.

AWARD:

In 2021 the American College of Sports Medicine Foundation will be offering one (1) Registration Award through the *Dr. Lisa S. Krivickas Clinician/Scholar Travel Award Fund*. The purpose of the award is to advance education for one (1) female applicant to present her scholarly work at ACSM's 68th Annual Meeting June 1-5, 2021. 2021 Dr. Lisa S. Krivickas Clinician/Scholar Registration Award

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Applicants must be female.
2. Applicants must have submitted and received acceptance for abstract and/or presentation at ACSM's 68th Annual Meeting. Preference will be given to scientific abstracts or presentations, although clinically based presentations will also be considered. *As final Annual Meeting abstract selections may not be released by this date, interested candidates are encouraged to apply with their submitted abstract, and verification of acceptance will be made during the application review process.*
3. Applicants must be the first author and presenter.
4. While all types of clinicians are invited to apply, preference will be given to the physicians (MD/DO or equivalent) or medical students in good standing with a research focus on sports medicine and exercise science. Financial need will not be a consideration for the application process.
5. Applicants who are medical students, medical residents or fellows must have a faculty sponsor sign the application, confirming the applicant is in good standing in an academic department.
6. Applicants must be ACSM members in good standing.
7. An applicant must list her presentation / abstract type and/or title as well as a letter (no longer than one page) explaining why she believes that her particular presentation / abstract emulates the legacy and work of Dr. Lisa Krivickas.
8. Awardee may be expected to attend the Women's Rathbone Memorial Breakfast and the ACSM Awards Banquet if they are redesigned for the virtual platform.
9. Applicants must complete the application and submit her presentation as a poster presentation in **pdf** format. (Note that your abstract could be selected by the Program Committee to be presented as an e-poster.) Posters will be evaluated in an 8-1/2 x 11-inch page size. Do not put excessive information on the poster. Look at a printed pdf before it is sent to ACSM. If you cannot read it because the print is too small or the graphics are not well-represented, you may need to modify your larger poster for the purpose of this award application. **Posters that are not clear and legible in an 8-1/2 x 11-inch format will not receive consideration.** A copy of the submitted text abstract should also accompany the application.
10. **Applications must be received by the ACSM office by 5:00 p.m. EST on April 5, 2021.** Applications should be directed to foundation@acsm.org, with the subject line "2021 Lisa S. Krivickas Clinician/Scholar Registration Award."
11. Announcement of award recipients will be made on May 3, 2021.
