Graduate Teaching Assistant (Master's and PhD)

Dr. Chris Black, director of the Sensory and Muscle Function Laboratory, is seeking applications for graduate teaching assistants for Fall 2019. Dr. Black's research interests are primarily in neuromuscular function, fatigue, physical activity and their interaction with musculoskeletal pain. The Sensory and Muscle Function Lab specializes in the use of non-invasive assessments of neuromuscular function (e.g. EMG, reflex function, and electrical stimulation) and the assessment of pain sensitivity to pressure, thermal, and electrical stimuli.

Accepted Master's and PhD students will receive a 9-month teaching assistantship (guaranteed for 2 years for Master's students and 4 years for PhD students) with a stipend (\$10,800 and \$14,800 for Master's and PhD students, respectively), full tuition waiver, and basic student insurance. The Department of Health and Exercise Science offers integrative exercise physiology programs at the Master's and PhD level featuring lecture and laboratory based courses in neuromuscular, cardiovascular, and pulmonary physiology, muscle metabolism, and body composition.
