Authors interested in submitting a manuscript should submit a structured abstract (Objectives, Design, Methods, Results, and Conclusions) of no more than 200 words to mayl@ecu.edu no later than the abstract deadline. If approved, abstract authors will be invited to submit a full manuscript for consideration under the normal peer review process. Questions should be directed to mayl@ecu.edu.

Background:

Translating evidence-based exercise and physical activity research to clinical application and broader dissemination and implementation is critical to improve the health and well-being of populations. This is especially important for women who engage in less physical activity than men and face unique challenges related to exercise and physical activity across the lifespan. Furthermore, exercise and physical activity effects reported in men do not necessarily generalize to women. Therefore, the *Translational Journal of the American College of Sports Medicine (TJACSM)* is calling for submission ideas for manuscripts to be published in a special issue related to translational research focused on women's health, sport, and physical activity. As per the *TJACSM* website:

The *Translational Journal* is an international, peer-reviewed, journal designed to disseminate translational science that is intended to inform researchers and practitioners. The journal also provides a venue for research on policy issues that affect implementation of research findings into clinical and community settings. The vision is to publish high-quality articles bridging the gap between basic and clinical research and practice in sports medicine and exercise science. This journal concentrates solely on the translation of science to action.



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The journal publishes original research, clinical trials, systematic review articles, and meta-analysis and policy research that discuss the translational implications of basic, clinical, and policy science to everyday real-world practice. Specifically, studies that apply basic and clinical research findings that move discovery and knowledge into clinical practice and community settings will be published.



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
