

## **Professor of Exercise Science (Open Rank)**

North Carolina Wesleyan University invites applications for a 9-month appointment as a tenure-track professor (rank open) of Exercise Science beginning in August 2023. Responsibilities may include, but are not limited to, teaching a variety of core classes at the undergraduate level varying from introductory to advanced exercise physiology courses; promoting program growth and academic quality; supervising student interns, and serving on internal committees. The successful candidate will be expected to provide courses in the undergraduate Exercise Science program and potentially at the Masters of Public Health program, that has been approved by the Faculty, and will launch in Fall 2023 if it is approved by accreditors. Faculty are expected to engage students through the use of both traditional and innovative instructional strategies. A regular load at North Carolina Wesleyan University is 12 hours per semester, but may vary based on teaching load in the graduate program.

North Carolina Wesleyan University, a liberal arts university affiliated with the United Methodist Church, emphasizes teaching excellence and personal attention. The University is located in Rocky Mount, North Carolina and serves approximately 1,500 students, including adult degree students in the Adult and Professional Studies program. Rocky Mount is in the eastern, coastal plains region of North Carolina, convenient to the Raleigh-Durham area and the beaches of the Outer Banks. Richmond, VA, Washington, DC, and the mountains of North Carolina are also within easy driving distance.

Qualifications: An earned doctoral degree in Exercise Science, or closely related field, is required. ABD candidates will be considered, but must have obtained Ph.D by August 2023. Previous college or university-level teaching experience, particularly in the area of kinesiology and biomechanics, strength and conditioning and/or clinical exercise physiology is strongly preferred. Evidence of scholarly activities such as submission of peer-reviewed publications and professional presentation is also highly desirable.

Initial applications should include: 1) a letter of application, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) copies of transcripts showing academic work in higher education and degrees received, and 4) three letters of professional reference, sent as a single pdf file.

Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until a suitable candidate is identified.
